#### **Background**

In 2008, the City launched the Don River and Central Waterfront Project with the goal of identifying a solution to capture and treat polluted stormwater and raw sewage from combined sewer overflows before it enters our waterways, thus helping to improve water quality and our environment. In addition, the Project will identify necessary upgrades to our sewer system infrastructure that will improve operations and service future growth.

The preferred solution, including new underground tunnels, storage tanks and shafts, and a treatment facility for wet weather flows, was presented at our last Public Open Houses held in May 2010. Since then, the study team has identified the preliminary preferred design for the Project which includes the proposed location of various facilities.

## Notice of Public Open House Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study

In 2008, the City of Toronto launched the Don and Central Waterfront Project to further the recommendations of the Wet Weather Flow Master Plan to capture and treat polluted stormwater and raw sewage from combined sewer overflows before it enters the Don River and Central Waterfront. This will help to improve water quality and our environment. In addition, the Project will identify upgrades necessary to critical sanitary trunk sewer infrastructure to improve operations and service future growth.

In May 2010, a series of Public Open Houses was held to present and seek input on the preferred solution, which includes new underground tunnels, storage tanks and shafts, and a treatment facility for wet weather flows. Since then the study team has identified the preliminary preferred design for the Project, which includes the proposed locations of various facilities.
